

History of Ag-Gag Bills in Arizona

The First Arizona Ag-Gag Bills: Animal and Ecological Terrorism

2004: [SB 1081](#) ecological and animal terrorism (Verschoor, C. Allen, Harper, Pearce) Passed the Legislature; Vetoed by Governor Napolitano

2005: [SB 1333](#) NOW: ecological and animal terrorism (Verschoor, Bee, Burns, et al) Passed the Legislature; Vetoed by Governor Napolitano

[SB 1166](#) NOW: terrorism; animal; ecological (Senator Verschoor) Passed the Legislature; Signed by Governor Napolitano

A Relative of Ag-Gag: Attempts to Silence Citizens' Voices

1995: [HB 2257](#) ("veggie hate-crimes bill") Passed the Legislature and signed into law

2006: [SCR 1035](#) food and agricultural security (Flake, Arzberger, Jarrett, Verschoor et al.) Failed in the Senate.

2008: [SB 1373](#) poultry husbandry (Burns, Aguirre, Arzberger, Flake, et al.) Passed the Legislature and signed into law

2013: [HB 2780](#) animal cruelty; ranching dogs (Judd, Gowan, Stevens) Passed the Legislature and signed into law

The New Ag-Gag Bills

2014: [HB 2587](#) livestock; animal cruelty; violation (Barton, Brophy McGee, Escamilla, Gowan, et al.) Passed the House but failed in the Senate.

2015: [HB 2150](#) animal cruelty; livestock; poultry; violation (Barton) Passed the Legislature; Vetoed by Governor Ducey
